

Bromsberrow Parish Council RISK ASSESSMENT FOR THE VOLUNTEER ACTIVITIES

Before starting ensure all volunteers:

- Volunteers to receive instruction of activities, regarding use of tools, equipment, installation processes and maintenance activities.
- Have the correct Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) eg Thick gloves, hi-viz vest, sensible footwear, weather appropriate clothing etc.
- Have the correct equipment and know how to use the equipment.
- Consider all the risks and hazards in the work area, eg roads/cycle ways, thorny bushes, low branches, uneven ground, etc.
- Know the work area and how to report incidents or hazards, where to get first aid, deposit waste and mark bags and record evidence of activity.

Use the table below to score the risks in the **Risk Assessment Table**:
